## 1 MARIENKIRCHE

Built between 1247 and 1343 as a Gothic basilica with late Romanesque elements in the choir area. West Tower (71 m) with gold-plated angel sculpture from 1343. In the city fire of 1726, the church was heavily damaged, but retained the late Gothic shrine and front of 1499. Between 1893 and 1901, fundamental restoration in the neo-Gothic style. In 1988, the Marienkirche was declared a “national cultural monument”.

### 2 FRIEDRICH LIST MEMORIAL

Friedrich List (1789–1846) was an economist, railroad pioneer, journalist and campaigner for the German customs union.

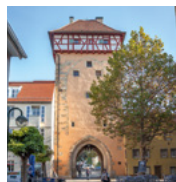
### 3 STADTMAUERHÄUSER

Along Jos-Weiß-Straße, you can find the rest of the medieval city wall and the city wall houses that were built adjacent to the wall in the 18th century.



### 4 GARTENTOR

First mentioned in 1392 as the New Gate, this was a sealed secondary gate until 1700. Exit to Gartenstraße since its creation from 1822. Renovated Gartentor fountain from 1931.



### 5 MARKTBRUNNEN AND MARKET SQUARE

Reutlingen was awarded market rights by Emperor Friedrich I Barbarossa in around 1180. Cobblestones on the market square show the outline of the Renaissance Town Hall, which was destroyed in the city fire of 1726. The market fountain was created by Leonhard Baumhauer in 1570 an renovated by Carl Lindenberger in 1901. A sculpture of Maximilian II, Holy Roman Emperor (1527–1576) as a knight is shown on the fountain column.





## 6 SPITALHOF

Built no later than the beginning of the 13th century. A hospital in medieval times, and later mainly an old people's home for the upper middle class. Medieval pillory image beneath the fascia, hospital coat of arms (16th century) by Hans Motz above the archway. Severe damage in the city fire of 1726.

## 7 NIKOLAIKIRCHE

Gothic chapel with building inscription of 1358. It is one of the few buildings, which was spared from the city fire of 1726 – even though the fire broke out not far from the church. The sculpture of the patron saint of the church from 1914 can be seen on the outer wall of the choir.



## 8 ZUNFTBRUNNEN

Fountain designed by Sculptor Bonifatius Stirnberg in 1983. Shows the 12 most important economic and political groups of craftsmen from the time of the guilds to 1500.



## 9 EISTURM

One of the few remaining towers of the external city fortifications. Later used as a municipal ice cellar (1877 to 1906).



## 10 TÜBINGER TOR

Gate Tower built in the mid-13th century. Half-timbered structure from 1330. Only preserved main gate of the medieval fortification. Late-Gothic crucifixion group in the trefoil on the external wall.



## SPREUERHOF-STRASSE

According to the Guinness Book of Records, the narrowest street in the world since 2006 – measuring just 31 centimetres at its narrowest point.

## HEIMATMUSEUM REUTLINGEN



Former municipal hall of the Königsbronn Abbey. The museum of local history shows the rich tradition of the former imperial town. Special features are a secret chapel from the Reformation, the vintner's guild room and the idyllic garden of the museum.

- 20 **WILHELMSTRASSE** is considered the lifeline of the historic city centre. The mixture of international brands and ownermanaged specialist retailer, the personal advice and the flair of the street cafes create the individual allure of the shopping mile.

- 22 To the east of the town hall is **KANZLEISTRASSE**, which crosses **OBERAMTEISTRASSE** nearby. Shop for special gifts and follow the pleasant aroma of coffee and chocolate.

## 25 WEEKLY MARKET

Reutlingen's weekly market is a magnet for the entire region. It is held on Tuesdays and Saturdays all year round, with the addition of Thursdays during the summer. As one of the largest weekly markets in Baden-Württemberg, it is a real feast for the senses with its colourful, abundant stands.



## 26 MÜLLER GALERIE

# City Oases

Relaxation in the city.

## ECHAZ

The Echaz is a small river that has shaped the city. Earlier, it was used predominantly to supply water to the tanner craft. It offers a place to slow down in the heart of the city centre in the civic park with its tiered banks. The nature trail along the banks of the Echaz provides the chance to learn a lot about this habitat.

## PLANIE

The chestnut and linden-lined alley, built in the 19th century, is bordered by impressive urban villas.

## STADTGARTEN

The municipal garden, which connects to Planie, was created in 1902. The park with its small pond, pavilions and playground invites you to linger some time and relax.

## POMOLOGIE

Idyllic park complex with playground, table-top mini golf, known as Pit-Pat, café, water fountains, paths; cultural venue.

## VOLKSPARK

The public park is right next to the Pomologie park. The state horticultural show was hosted here in 1984.



## ACHALM

The 707-metre high Achalm is Reutlingen's local mountain and the emblem of the city with a grandiose view over Reutlingen and the Swabian Alb.

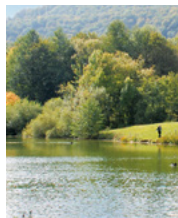


## BIOSPHEREGEBIET SCHWÄBISCHE ALB

## LOCAL RECREATIONAL AREA MARKWASEN

You can leave everyday life behind you here in the natural recreational area and enjoy the fresh air of the forest. The old oaks and linden trees invite you to take a walk. Children will definitely be thrilled by the game reserve. In the adjoining sports and leisure park, there are a number of sports grounds.

## NATURE RESERVE LISTHOF

Just a stone's throw from Reutlingen's city centre, natural meadows with chirping birds, gently splashing brooks and shady forests reveal themselves to visitors. And the Umweltbildungszentrum Listhof, an environmental education centre, invites you to marvel, research and experiment with its several natural experience areas, biotopes and a crawling animal house.







## LICHTENSTEIN CASTLE & ADVENTURE PARK




The romantic fairy-tale castle of Württemberg was built between 1840 and 1842 in the new-Gothic style according to the image from Wilhelm Hauff's novel. Take a tour and marvel at the magnificent chambers. Directly next to it is the castle's adventurepark, which invites climbing fans to try out the different climbing routes set into the treetops.
